## Shuttlelicious Recipes

**Vegetable Dip (Southern Salsa)** provided by Gail Gehlken  
2 cans of black eyed peas without meat (Drain and Rinse the peas)  
1 can of white corn (Drained)  
1 large firm tomato, chopped  
4-5 green onions, chopped  
1 white onion, chopped  
1 green pepper, chopped  
1 cup chopped parsley  
1 tablespoon cilantro  
2 cloves garlic, chopped  
1 bottle of Italian salad dressing (large bottle)

Combine all vegetables and spices in a large bowl. Add the salad dressing and toss lightly. Marinate in the refrigerator for 8 to 10 hours. Serve with tortilla chips.

**Apple Coleslaw** provided by Grace Lee  
2 cups Cabbage (shredded)  
2 medium Apples (cored, diced)  
1 can (16oz) Crushed Pineapple (drained)  
¾ cup Mayonnaise

Combine above ingredients, cover and refrigerate 1 hour or more before serving.

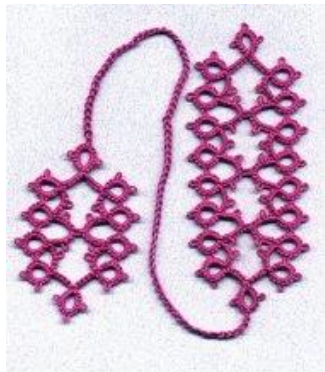
# PATTERNS OF THE MONTH

## Simple Bookmark

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1 Shuttle and ball thread.  
Size 20 thread (or desired size and color).

Size 14 crochet hook.



Begin by crocheting a chain approx. 10 inches long, leaving at least 1.5 inch tails at both ends.

All picots are small.

1. R. 4 - 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
2. C. 5. RW
3. R. 4 - 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
4. C. 3 - 3. RW
5. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW (Joining to last picot of previous ring.)
6. C. 3 - 3 - 3 - 3. RW
7. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
8. C. 3 - 3. RW
9. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
10. C. 3 - 3 - 3 - 3. RW

26. C. 3 - 3. RW
27. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW

### Small Motif

1. R. 4 - 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
2. C. 5. RW
3. R. 4 - 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
4. C. 3 - 3. RW
5. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW (Joining to last picot of previous ring.)
6. C. 3 - 3 - 3 - 3. RW
7. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
8. C. 3 - 3. RW
9. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
10. C. 5, RW
11. R. 4 - 4 + 4 - 4, cl. RW (Joining to end chain of crochet chain, tating in the loose ends for remaining stitches. Close ring and clip loose end close to the ring.)
12. C. 5, RW
13. R. 4 - 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
14. C. 3 - 3. RW
15. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW (Joining to last picot of previous ring.)
16. C. 3 - 3 + 3 - 3. RW (Joining to corresponding chain on opposite side. Tat in loose end as previously done.)
17. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
18. C. 3 - 3. RW
19. R. 4 + 4 - 4 - 4, cl. RW
20. C. 5. Tie ends off.

# Angelique

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## Abbreviations.

R ring, - picot , + join, +st join with shuttle thread,  
rw reverse work, cl close, ch chain, sp small picot

Note: Instructions have been kept brief to be worked alongside the diagram. Two diagrams are shown to facilitate both left and right-handed workers.

Angelique worked in Coats Floretta #20

Ring A: 9-9 cl Rw

Chain a: 5-5-5-5-5-5-+st turn

Chain b: 7+7+8+8+9+9 join to base of ring A

Chain c: 10 join to picot of ring A with st

Chain d: 10 rw

Ring B: 7+7 (the join is into the picot of ring A) cl rw

Chain e: 7

Ring C: 7+7 (join is into picot of ring A) cl Do Not rw

Chain f: 7+ turn,

Ring D: 7 join to base of ring C, 7 cl turn

Chain g: 7

Ring E: 9 cl

Chain h 7+ (join into base of ring D)

Chain i: 7+ rw

Ring F: 7+7 cl (join is to junction of Ring C and chain c) rw

Chain j: 7 rw

Ring G 7+7 (join is to junction of base ring B ch d) rw and turn

Chain k: leave a small space 3-3-3-3 join to base of ring F with shuttle thread and turn

Chain l: sp2-2+2-2+2-2+2-2+2-2 join to small space (all joins with shuttle thread) turn

Row 1: ch 10, (rw R 9+9 rw ch 4-8+st8+4) repeat bold print twice rw R 9+9 rw ch 10 join into space at waist. Cut and tie. (See diagram). This ends the first section.

With shuttle and ball

Row 2: ch 10, (rw R 9+9 rw ch 5-8+st8+5) repeat bold print twice more rw R9+9 rw ch 10 join (see diagram) cut and tie.

With shuttle and ball

Row 3: ch 12, (rw R 11+11 rw ch 7-9+st9+7) repeat bold print twice more rw R11+11 ch 12 join (see diagram) cut and tie.

With shuttle and ball

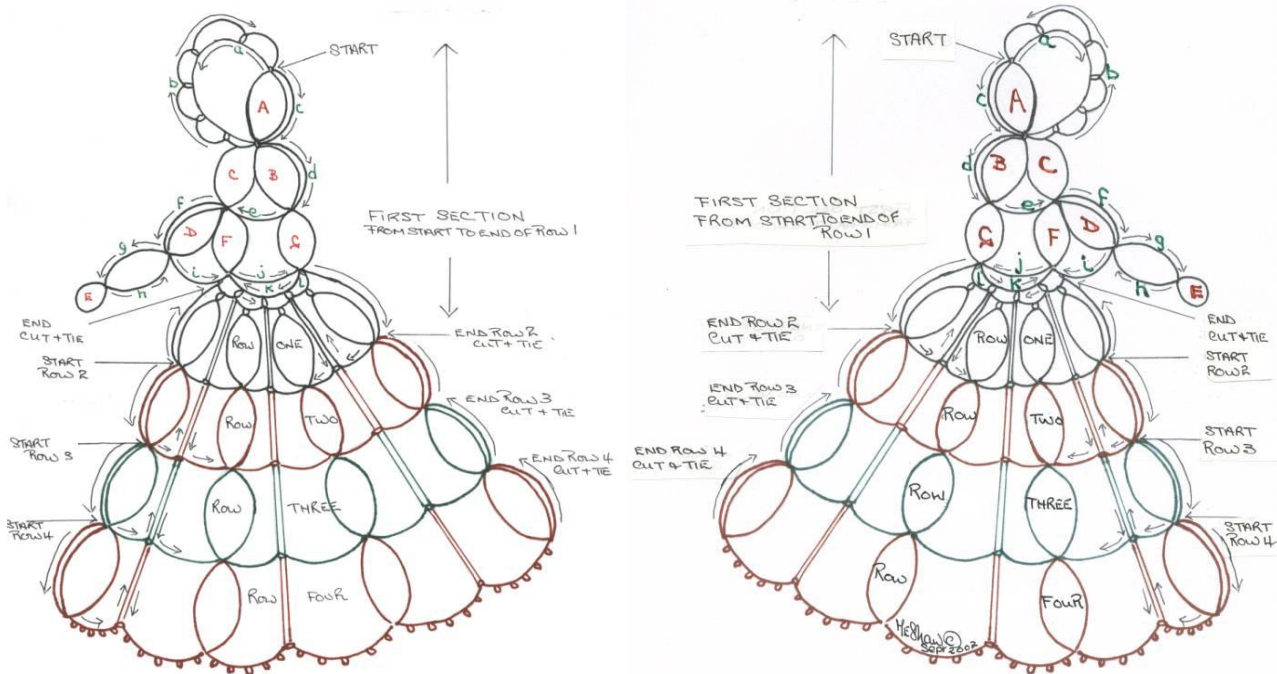
Row 4: ch 14 (rw R 13+13 rw ch 2-2-2-2-2-2-10+10+2-2-2-2-2-2) repeat bold print twice more R13+13

ch 14 join (see diagram) cut and tie.



The threads down the back of the skirt can be tied into bows for decoration.

Daffodils. Ring 1-2-2-1cl. Repeat this 5 or 7 times. Tie and cut leaving about 4 inches of thread. Fasten a length of green thread under the cluster of rings. Tie flower thread again Cut flower threads close. Cut stems to about one and half inches.
